





Why is this important?









Case Study

USING AI CHATBOTS TO LURE STRANGERS TO STALKING VICTIM'S HOME

A man was using platforms such as Crushon.Al to create his own chatbots and impersonate his victims. The victim's personal details were leaked on these chatbots which encouraged strangers to come to her home. Crushon.Al is one of several applications that use Al to recreate an image so that the person is nude. Majority of the services work on women and result in blackmail and extortion. In December 2024, Crushon.Al recorded 27.81 million visits with this number increasing each month. Over 75% of the users are males between the ages of 18 to 34.


While these types of Al platforms encourage creativity, they do not protect privacy.




Considerations
